O EOG scores in Language Arts/Mathematics determine promotion to high school
O Placement in courses is based upon the assessments grades earned in Middle School

## General Information About Placement

Current eighth grade teachers will make course recommendations for core classes based on standards set by data of student success

- will depend on student's assessment grades
- not teacher discretion - based on specific guidelines given by Walton
- may have different levels in core classes
- Possible to change level of study during high schoolwe encourage you to challenge yourself!

Waiver Process-Due May $1^{\text {st }}$ and Nov 15 $5^{\text {th }}$ - Parents may submit to change level of course. Consider overall load, interest and life balance.
